Street Outreach Services: Teamwork Makes the Dreamwork

YOUTH: reStart's Youth Street Outreach team collaborates regularly with Synergy Services and Drumm Farm, both of whom also serve youth. According to Rick with Synergy Services, he has never experienced collaboration like this before, "With our Youth Outreach Programs working together, we have great connections across the teams. The interaction is one of mutual respect and the desire to change lives," he continues. Each program has strengths, so youth have a clear picture of what to expect. Sometimes this also affords youth a choice based on their own personal needs. "The last thing anyone wants to say is that we don't have room for a youth in crisis, so knowing we have each other as a resource makes a huge difference," says Lorin from Drumm Farms' Transitional Living Program.

reStart's youth street outreach case manager, Hannah, agrees: "We share resources, information and ideas. We are 'experts' in our geographic areas and want to place youth where they can thrive. reStart's COO, Jonathan, adds: "Collaborative work means that we are not duplicating services. We are sharing resources to help more people." By spreading across the community, the team is also able to track school engagement and check lists to see who is already engaged versus those who are still in need. Having more touch points and solutions allows us to meet the growing needs.

ADULT: Monday mornings, reStart's Adult Street Outreach Team collaborates with KCPD, KCFD, Veteran's Community Project and Synergy Services as they respond to calls made to 211 for help. From stops behind store fronts, to hidden neighborhood camps, the team responds to reported call locations while also looking for others who may need help. They provide water, grab & go meals, hygiene kits and human interaction while trying to assess the needs and offer resources to those they meet. This partnership results in more people accessing a wider variety of resources. Follow up visits are made later.



Wash Wednesdays: Another program, Wash Wednesdays has become one of our most impactful outreach efforts. Each Wednesday the outreach team visits homeless camps throughout the metro and offers rides to Gates Plaza Ultra Wash. While there, neighbors can wash clothing and bedding, receive lunch and water, and engage in conversation and resource connections with case managers. We find the response of folks needing help is so much more relaxed while they engage in an activity that helps to restore dignity and hygiene. Pictured below are Christopher, Colby and Abraham who were recent volunteers and donors to Wash Wednesday. What a gift it is for participants to freshen their belongings and potentially gain the confidence they may need to accept more help related to housing, employment or their health. Volunteer Spotlight: Michelle & Trish

Volunteers make a huge impact at reStart! Whether serving meals, leading classes, helping with events or other activities, volunteers enhance the quality of life for our program participants. Michelle and Trish are two of our most dedicated volunteers. "It all started during the pandemic," explains Trish. "The world was shutting down and everything felt overwhelming. I asked Michelle if she'd be interested in joining me to do something for reStart." Michelle adds: "It was good timing for me after leaving a long-term job. I was not sure what was next and loved the idea of doing something helpful. We began donating sack lunches. While that seemed small, it was important." Their one-time pandemic effort has blossomed into a weekly volunteer gig, and the sandwiches have become an important component of our Street Outreach efforts.

In addition, they have recruited friends and family. Michelle's mother in law helps in with sandwich ingredients and back to school supplies, and recently a good friend joined them as a volunteer at our recent Back to School event. Trish acknowledges that In the midst of COVID her daughter died. Crediting a Katharine Hepburn quote, she believes "If you are hurting and feel bad, go find someone else who is hurting and help them." Her grief is less when she helps. Michelle and Trish's 25-year friendship is now a lifeline for others through volunteering. reStart is honored by their energy and generosity. *Inspired? Join us!*

Your support and investment of resources and trust, move our mission forward. Each person we serve has a unique story of courage and adversity. Thanks to your partnership we are moving people from homelessness to housing. Here are two recent success stories:

Lizette

"I don't know what would have happened to me without reStart," says Lizette, a 60 year old disabled woman with a history of mental health, PTSD, and temper barriers. Lizette had been imprisoned and homeless twice before she found reStart. Since entering our program, she has completely turned her life around. Leaving prison she had \$5 to her name, she was on parole and required to stay here in an unfamiliar city. Once in the hospital receiving psychiatric treatment and necessary medication to improve her life, Lizette was referred to reStart.

"At reStart, I was given a place to stay, caseworkers, and people to help me. I am thankful for this, as I'm sure I would have gotten in trouble on my own." With case worker support, Lizette has obtained legal documents and appointments that will help her live on her own. She has struggled with walking her whole life, and through a partnership with Healing Canvas, she has also secured a walker and is much more mobile: "Now I can walk with a walker. Next I will master a cane. I'll never give up." Lizette is now thriving! She has also learned to manage her temper and has embraced sobriety. "I can't imagine a more successful case than mine, and I am forever grateful. reStart is a wonderful, life-saving facility."
