Update from the CEO

In 2022, with a passionate staff, dedicated volunteers, and invested donors, reStart Inc. met the needs of almost 2,800 of Kansas City's most vulnerable youth, families, individuals, and veterans with no home. We remain committed to our mission "to empower all people facing or experiencing homelessness by providing housing and services that inspire hope.'

Each January, we engage with a number of other organizations in the Point in Time Count across the metro to count the number of people on the street and in shelter who are experiencing homelessness. The numbers influence the amount of HUD Funding that may come to our region, while also providing data on subset populations and overall numbers and trends. It is highly concerning to report that the number of our neighbors navigating homelessness in Kansas City increased by 31%. With staggering inflation on things like food, fuel, utilities and housing, this increase should not surprise us.

This real time data demands that we continue to pursue our mission with excellence in mind. In addition, it sheds light on how critically our community needs affordable housing for the low and extremely low-income households. Having adequate safe, stable housing that is affordable to the lowest income levels allows us to help guide residents to safe housing options so that they never have to experience homelessness.

Our strategic plan calls us to continue our current work with emergency shelter, transitional living, wrap around services and permanent housing; while committing ourselves to our vision of ending homelessness in Kansas City. With innovative community leaders, supportive neighborhoods, and committed individuals and organizations alongside us, we can prioritize affordable housing and end homelessness!

Our 2022 Impact

- \bigcirc We served 85,675 meals on an average monthly budget of \$3,000.
- We placed 494 individuals in permanent housing.
 - We diverted 1,045 people from homelessness.
- We placed 49 families in permanent housing.
 - We provided employment services for 269 individuals.
 - We served 202 veterans.
 - We provided 121,333 nights of shelter.
